#### FIRST LESSON

Luke 19:28-40 The Entry Into Jerusalem

Narrator 1: Having said this, Jesus went ahead with the ascent to Jerusalem. Approaching Bethphage and Bethany, near what is called the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two of the disciples with these instructions:

Jesus:

"Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it?" just say this, 'The Lord needs it."

Narrator 2:

They departed on their errand and found things just as Jesus had said. As they untied the colt, its owners said to them, "Why are you doing that?"
