The 349th Annual Meeting of the First Congregational Church of Greenwich, Old Greenwich, CT, is hereby called for Sunday, June 28, 2020, at 11:00 AM EDT. Due to State of Connecticut COVID-19 guidance and the need for social distancing, the meeting will be held electronically via Zoom.us:

- To hear the Annual Reports of the Pastors, Officers, Committees, Organizations and Departments;
- To approve Minutes of prior congregational meetings in the past year;
- To amend the By-Laws as recommended by the Church Council;
- To elect Officers for the ensuing year;
- To adopt the budget for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2020;

SECOND LESSON

Genesis 21: 8-21 (Common English Bible)
