Luke 6: 27-38 Common English Bible



If someone slaps you on the cheek, offer the other one as well. If someone takes your coat, don't withhold your shirt either. Give to everyone who asks and don't demand your things back from those who take them. Treat people in the same way that you want them to treat you.

MUSIC NOTES

As February is *Black History Month*, most of the music sung or played in worship during the month will be of a gospel or spiritual nature.

The prelude is an arrangement of the spiritual "Nobody knows..." by Florence Price. She was born in Little Rock, AR, educated at the New England Conservatory of Music, and noted as the first African American woman to be recognized as a symphonic composer, and first to have a composition played by a major orchestra – the Chicago Symphony Orchestra in 1933.

The Chancel Choir anthem returns to one of its favorite anthems from last fall, "Walk in the light". The original music source dates from 1890 by George Elderkin. Gospel great Thomas Whitfield transcribed and altered the music in 1983, while composer/arranger Brandon Waddles crafted the version sung this morning in 2017. Brandon's father, Alvin, is a legendary gospel pianist/organist in the Detroit area, and Alvin and I graduated from Interlochen Arts Academy together.

During the offertory, Danny Young sings a stirring arrangement of "His eye is on the sparrow" by Mark Hayes. Mark Hayes is a Kansas City based composer whose compositions and arrangements are known for their unique American sound, drawing from such diverse musical styles such as gospel, jazz, pop, folk and classical. His personal catalog, totaling over 1,500 published works, includes work for solo voice, solo piano, multiple pianos, orchestra, jazz combo, small instrumental ensembles, and choruses of all kinds.

The postlude is by Francis Johnson, who was the first African American musician to have his compositions published. "He directed military bands and society dance orchestras, taught music, and performed on the violin and keyed bugle. His early career consisted of performing for balls, parades, and dancing schools. He first became widely known in 1818 when George Willig published Johnson's Collection of New Cotillions. His career flourished in the 1820s, as he performed arrangements of "fashionable" music for most of the major dance functions in Philadelphia." (Wikipedia)
