GATHERING PRAYER



Luke 13: 1-9 Common English Bible

COVID-19 MASK POLICY UPDATE

WORSHIP:

The Re-Opening Task Force met recently and determined we will continue to wear masks during the worship hour. From the beginning of the pandemic, the Re-Opening Task Force decided to wait 30 days after any changes were made to community wide policies and procedures out of an abundance of caution. We are following that protocol on masking guidance in addition to taking into consideration that our youngest church members can still not be vaccinated. The task force will meet at the end of the month and decide on the use of masks during worship. We look forward to seeing everyone's beautiful faces during worship, singing and praying to our God and Creator, which we sincerely hope will be soon.

NON-WORSHIP:

The Re-Opening Task Force recognizes that the groups using our spaces during the week and on the weekends serve populations who are eligible for full vaccination, which is our best tool for protection from the virus. As such, the task force determined it was safe to follow the community protocols to go mask optional. All committees, groups, and outside organizations now have the choice to mask while in the building.

MUSIC NOTES

The Chancel Choir anthem is by the English composer Thomas Attwood. His career began with an appointment as organist at St. Paul's Cathedral in London while also a court composer for the Chapel Royal. In 1823, he was chosen to be a professor at the Royal Academy of Music. His funeral took place at St. Paul's and is buried in the crypt of the church.

The postlude is by the German composer F. W. Zachau, who was organist at several prominent German churches. He was also the first teacher of G. F. Handel. "Zachow's teaching was so effective, that in 1702 at the age of seventeen, Handel accepted a position as organist at the former Dom in Halle. It is said that after Zachow died in 1712, Handel became a benefactor to his widow and children in gratitude for his teacher's instruction. In 1713, J.S. Bach was invited as Zachow's successor."
