

Luke 15: 1-10
The Message

By this time a lot of men and women of questionable reputation were hanging around Jesus, listening intently. The Pharisees and religion scholars were not pleased, not at all pleased. They growled, "He takes in sinners and eats meals with them, treating them like old friends." Their grumbling triggered this story.

"Suppose one of you had a hundred sheep and lost one. Wouldn't you leave the ninetynine in the wilderness and go after the lost one until you found it? When found, you can be sure you would put it across your shoulders, rejoicing, and when you got home call in your friends and neighbors, saying, 'Celebrate with me! I've found my lost sheep!' Count on it—there's more joy in heaven over one sinner's rescued life than over ninety-nine good people in no need of rescue.

"Or imagine a woman who has ten coins and loses one. Won't she light a lamp and scour the house, looking in every nook and cranny until she finds it? And when she finds it you can be sure she'll call her friends and neighbors: 'Celebrate with me! I found my lost coin!' Count on it—that's the kind of party God's angels throw every time one lost soul turns to God."

SECOND LESSON

Luke 15: 11-24 The Message

Then he said, "There was once a man who had two sons. The younger said to his father, 'Father, I want right now what's coming to me.'

"So the father divided the property between them. It wasn't long before the younger son packed his bags and left for a distant country. There, undisciplined and dissipated, he wasted everything he had. After he had gone through all his money, there was a bad famine all through that country and he began to feel it. He signed on with a citizen there who assigned him to his fields to slop the pigs. He was so hungry he would have eaten the corn-cobs in the pig slop, but no one would give him any.

"That brought him to his senses. He said, 'All those farmhands working for my father sit down to three meals a day, and here I am starving to death. I'm going back to my father. I'll say to him, Father, I've sinned against God, I've sinned before you; I don't deserve to be called your son. Take me on as a hired hand.' He got right up and went home to his father.

"When he was still a long way off, his father saw him. His heart pounding, he ran out, embraced him, and kissed him. The son started his speech: 'Father, I've sinned against God, I've sinned before you; I don't deserve to be called your son ever again.'

"But the father wasn't listening. He was calling to the servants, 'Quick. Bring a clean set of clothes and dress him. Put the family ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Then get a prize-winning heifer and roast it. We're going to feast! We're going to have a wonderful time! My son is here—given up for dead and now alive! Given up for lost and now found!' And they began to have a wonderful time.



COVID-19 MASK POLICY UPDATE

WORSHIP:

The Re-Opening Task Force met recently and determined we will continue to wear masks during the worship hour. From the beginning of the pandemic, the Re-Opening Task Force decided to wait 30 days after any changes were made to community wide policies and procedures out of an abundance of caution. We are following that protocol on masking guidance in addition to taking into consideration that our youngest church members can still not be vaccinated. The task force will meet next week and decide on the use of masks during worship. We look forward to seeing everyone's beautiful faces during worship, singing and praying to our God and Creator, which we sincerely hope will be soon.

NON-WORSHIP:

The Re-Opening Task Force recognizes that the groups using our spaces during the week and on the weekends serve populations who are eligible for full vaccination, which is our best tool for protection from the virus. As such, the task force determined it was safe to follow the community protocols to go mask optional. All committees, groups, and outside organizations now have the choice to mask while in the building.
