




Christmas Eve Saturday, December 24, 2022 10 a.m.

we could trust it and it would not lead us astray. We weren't scared anymore. Our hearts were made ready for the best thing yet. (the fourth

candle is lit)

All: Love was found. We relight the beacon of love, for the promises

always kept.

One: And now the light has grown strong. And it is here. And it is the best

and brightest thing we have ever seen. It lights up everything. It dazzles and wows. The light has come to us and is with us forever. (the Christ

candle is lit)

All: Jesus is born! We give thanks for the light of Christ, shining in the

lives of all God's people.

# CHRISTMAS EVE GIFTS FOR COVENANT TO CARE FOR CHILDREN OF CT (formerly known as white gifts)

White Gifts are clothing, toys, books, or other useful items that, for many years, have been offered on Christmas Eve. Typically wrapped in white paper, they would give the illusion of snow under the trees in the Meetinghouse.

This year we will be collecting the gifts, however, they do not need to be wrapped. All gifts will be donated to *Covenant To Care for Children* in Hartford, CT, who distributes them throughout the year to children who are in the statewide foster care system. Bring them to any of the Christmas Eve services and place them under the tree in the narthex before entering the sanctuary.
