





### NALOXONE ADMINISTRATION TRAINING

Tuesday October 24, 7:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. at First Church

This in-person, 1 hour training presented by Kaitlin Comet, MA, a Program Coordinator for HUB\*, provides information on opioids that include street drugs (like heroin) and prescription drugs (like Oxycontin). Opioid overdoses have become an epidemic; in Connecticut, on average, two people die every



day from an opioid overdose. By the end of this training participants will learn how to administer naloxone, also known as Narcan, which can reverse an opioid overdose in a few minutes.

### MEDICARE ENROLLEES: ARE YOU PAYING TOO MUCH FOR YOUR PRESCRIPTION DRUGS OR INSURANCE?

The open enrollment period for Medicare Part D prescription drug insurance is October 15 to December 7. The plan you have now may not be the most cost-effective plan next year. ### **Guidelines for Vehicles:**


- Vehicles will park in the front parking lot and be assigned to one of our 60 designated spaces
